

It appears that each time the Editor Text Area edit window is opened and a dropdown is selected, a “menu” div shows up for each time the dropdown has been clicked and the edit window closed and reopened.



EXAMPLE: Opened Edit Window 4 times, clicked the Format dropdown 3 times.

Then clicked it off, so 1st instance shows display:none


Below screenshot shows the multiple divs.

EXAMPLE: Opened Edit Window 5 times, clicked the Format dropdown 2 times. Clicked the Font Size dropdown 2 times.

Then clicked each off, so 1st instance shows display:none

Does not matter how many times s field's Editor Text Area window is opened, new menu divs are only being created each time the dropdown is clicked after an Editor Text Area window is closed, then opened again.


So, if I were to close the Editor Window in the example below, then open it again and click on Font Size, a 3rd menu div would appear for the fontsizeselect_menu.
